

It is my hope and prayer that God may continue to bless what we do here at Arndell Anglican College and I look forward to serving you all in the year ahead.






CHAPLAINCY CHAT REV JEREMY CLARK

Christ-Centred Learning Community

For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ.

2 Corinthians 1:20a (NIV)



As I begin I recognise that many may not hold the same view as myself, even other Christians will disagree with some of what is said. As I've said in my Biblical Studies classes this year, this is good when we do it respectfully. I hope in humility that what is said is respectful and true. I also hope this might begin a conversation that is fruitful and beneficial for all.

Firstly, we need to have a place to go where we can find out about this 'Christ'. We believe the Bible is where his story is revealed. This explains why we give such importance to the teaching of the Bible in Chapels, Biblical Studies and Christian Education classes. In fact, I would argue the whole Bible is actually about Jesus Christ, as all of God's promises are made true by him (2 Corinthians 1:20).

So, as we begin considering a Christ-centred learning community we begin with the Bible. In fact, it could be worth getting it out, or asking your child what they learnt from the Bible this week at school. I know every time I open it I have my eyes opened a bit more to who Jesus is and why he came. These last few weeks I've been struck by the supremacy of Jesus, which I'll turn to next time.


Lunchtime activities have also resumed. Students in Years 1-6 are able to come to the library after eating time to participate in our daily activities.
